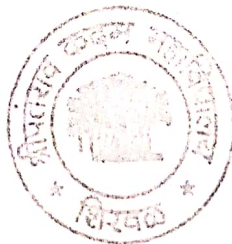

These text-books are designed to teach Communication Skills as well as skills of Reading Comprehension and Composition, keeping in mind the needs of the students, as per UGC, Government and CBCS Pattern. This text-book for B.A. Part I includes skills which should help our students to learn human values as well as use of English in different formal and informal situations.

This text-book for B.A. Part I is being published under the title Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (English for Communication). The syllabus of English for this book caters for the needs of the students of Arts in our colleges, who would like to be proficient in their spoken and written communication in English.

The course of Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course for B.A.Part I is divided into two semester- Section I for the First Semester and Section II for the Second Semester.
